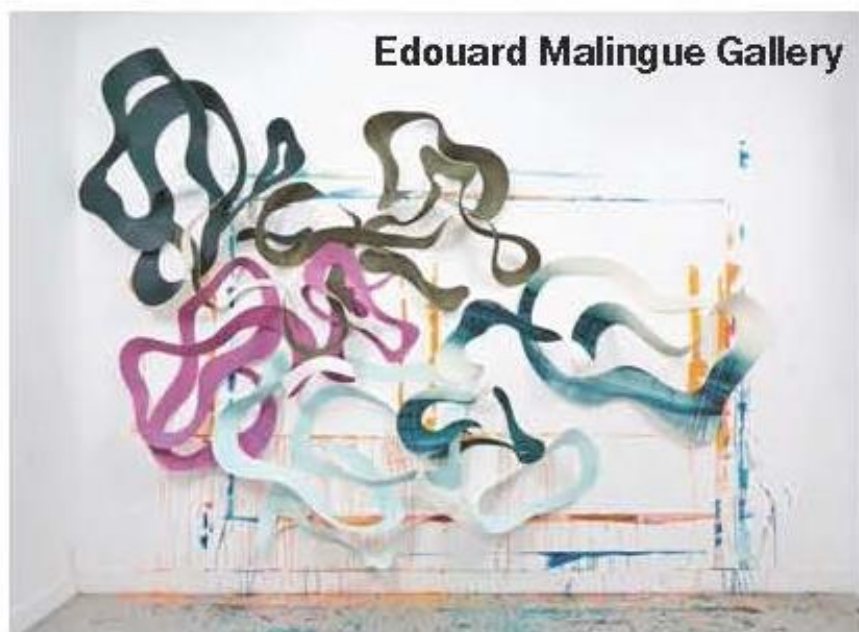

JANAINA TSCHÄPE (CONTEMPLATING LANDSCAPE)

14 March 2014 - 03 May 2014

Eduard Malingue Gallery is pleased to present 'Contemplating Landscape', the first solo exhibition in Hong Kong of renowned New York-based artist Janaina Tschäpe (b. 1973, Germany/Brazil) that explores, through multiple mediums, amorphous landscapes and their abundant lush properties. Of Brazilian and German descent, Tschäpe commenced her artistic career by completing a Fine Arts degree in Hamburg, Germany and a residency programme in Salvador, Brazil before moving to New York for her Masters of Fine Arts in 1997. Over the past decade and a half, Tschäpe has through her photography and video work, as well as her paintings and sculptures, expressed a flourishing creativity attune to earthy landscapes, ethereal female silhouettes as well as aqueous tones and biological forms. Indeed, in a contemporary society where increasingly the concerted composition is what dominates our views, Tschäpe has built an irrefragable rapport with nature, presenting it in lush and proximity for one to revel in its abundantly burgeoning vitality and variety.

'Contemplating Landscape' observes, reconsider and recasts the various elements found in nature: its shapes and forms, their vivacity and impermanence, flora and fauna's flashes of colour and fluidity. From the abstract and delicately rendered watercolour on paper works to the bold sculptural creations that echo the geometries of those biomorphic patches that flourish across her larger canvas paintings, Tschäpe presents a series of works that transpose the viewer into a space replete with artistic organisms that collectively form the composite of an articulated botanical vision. As such, 'Contemplating Landscape' urges a rethinking of our environment from not only a completely immersive standpoint but also on a more microscopic and intimate level: these are the artistic incursions of the biological that surround us and their constant amelioration provides a precious opportunity to approach and interact with those elements that ultimately form us.

Tschäpe's paintings, works on paper and drawings are wonderfully vivid and organic, colour and form spread across two-dimensional space, filling it with light, warmth and that microscopic flora which dampens bare earth. Tschäpe's painting Dark Sea (2014), in particular, is intricately attuned with aqueous garden landscapes and through the paint's permitted drip and fluidity evokes the natural process of blossoming, flourishing and decay. Similarly organic, yet on a more minute scale, Tschäpe's works on paper transcend a distinct microscopic quality: Hydromedusa (2014) seems to be composed of biomorphic patches of dark green and blue colour, whilst Spiny Marbles (2014) appears as an abstract composition of these yellow details amidst a sea of lightly intermingled wisps of colour. Also on display will be a sketchbook, Polygons (2014), in which a series of drawings have been loosely rendered, recalling nature's delicacy, variety and evanescence.

Moving from two to three dimensions are Tschäpe's cutouts and new sculptural works. The former, such as Ocean Study I (2014), are made of strips of paper that have been painted on one side in vivid colours and hang from the gallery wall in an ad hoc manner that resembles, in their random arrangement, the loosely tangled sinuous lines of plant life. Also on display for the first time will be a set of sculptures made of paper, which neatly folded, resemble prisms - gems from her paintings that have been brought to life. Placed amidst the gallery, they complement the wall hung works yet also operate as interventions of the gallery space, themselves acting as elements that have been inserted in the natural landscape. To this effect, they recall and complement the film work on display, Balgame (2012), which captures a large clear ball that travels buoyantly amidst a beach and watercourse. An aggrandised vision of an underwater bubble, the motioning element references the natural yet appears surrealist when it interacts with and is lowered in the natural scenery.

Overall, 'Contemplating Landscape' presents a series of works that are replete with sensory excitement and draw with viewers a concrete world filled with burgeoning flora and fauna. Upon the occasion of the landmark exhibition, a monograph will also be made available, which presents Tschäpe's most recent work as well as her previous and evolving practice. The publication will feature four accompanying essays in English and Traditional Chinese with contributions made by four leading curators and writers from around the world: Dr. Annette Bhagwati (Project Director of the Anthropocene Project, Haus der Kulturen der Welt, Berlin, Germany), Mariana Pissoc (Independent Curator, Singapore), Dr. David Gruber (Writer & Professor of Biology, CUNY, New York) and Ricardo Sardenberg (Curator, Rio de Janeiro). The exhibition and monograph collectively set to explore the variety of Tschäpe's practice and capture the pluralistic fervour that runs through her creations.

Janaina Tschäpe is a highly celebrated international artist who has held exhibitions of her work across different mediums in prestigious institutions around the world including MMA, Dublin, Rubin Museum, New York, Museo de Arte Moderna, Rio de Janeiro and Jeu de Paumes, Paris. Widely recognised for her exquisite interaction with nature and the landscape, Tschäpe's work is held in multiple distinguished public collections such as the Centre Pompidou, Paris, National Gallery of Art, Washington, Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York, Thyssen-Bornemisza Art Contemporary, Vienna, Austria and the Instituto Centro de Arte Contemporânea, Minas Gerais, Brazil, amongst others.

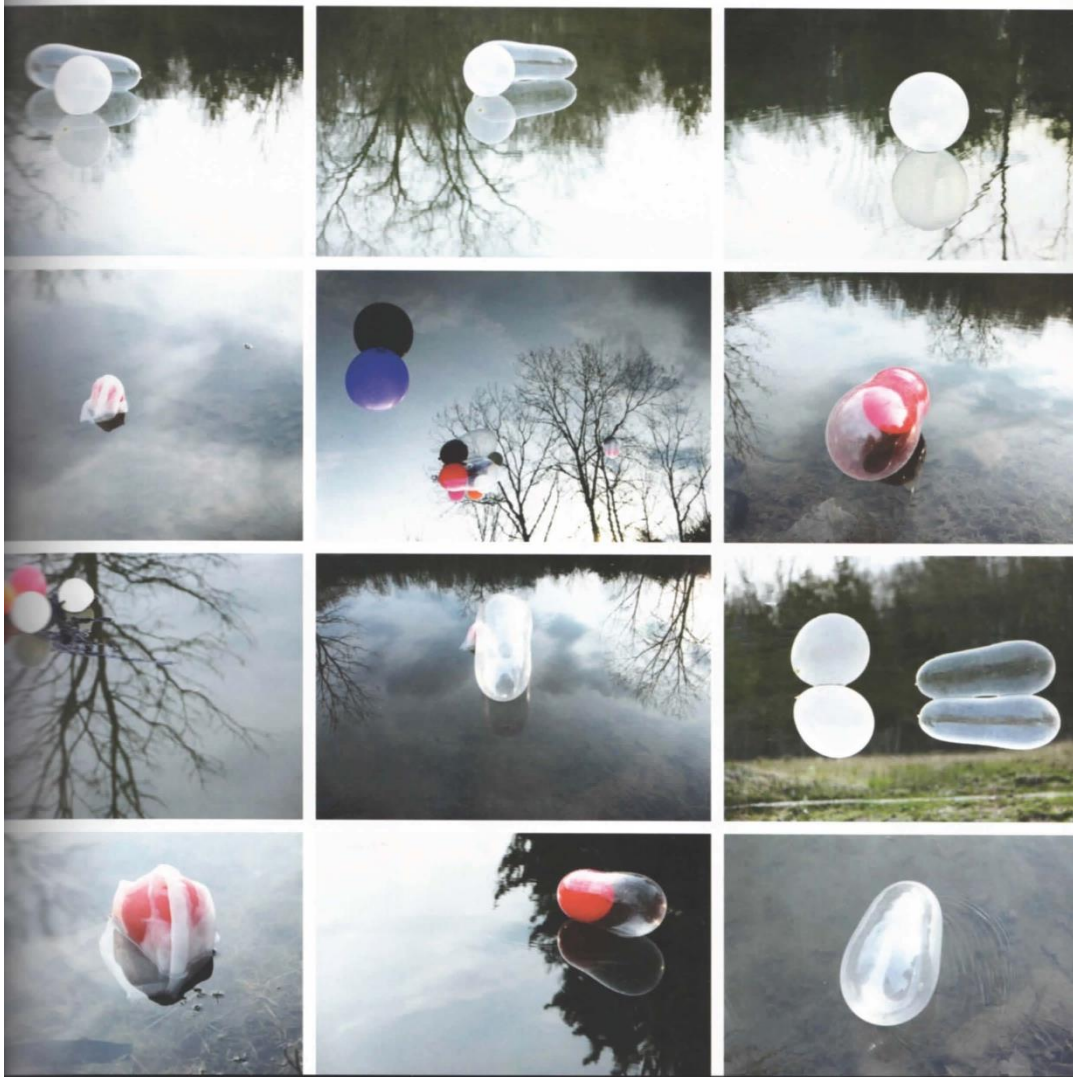
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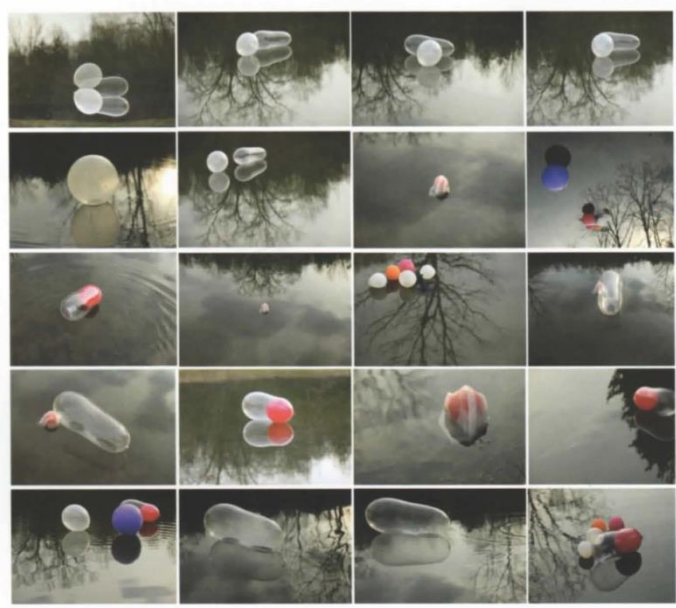

CONTEMPLATING LANDSCAPE



Janaina Tschäpe has touched down in town with her first solo exhibition in Hong Kong, *Contemplating Landscape*. The highly celebrated, internationally-renowned artist greeted us in front of her work in a pair of down-to-earth jeans. Carrying a resplendent grin and a glass of something that looks like wine, Tschäpe's presence sets the whole gallery aglow by her sunny and humble vibe.

Born in 1973 and of Brazilian and German descent, Tschäpe has, through her photography and video works as well as paintings and cutouts, expressed a kaleidoscopic range of creativity attuned to earthly landscapes, ethereal female silhouettes, aqueous tones and biological forms. Her vivacious and robust exhibition – currently on display at Edouard Malingue Gallery – does not cease to pour out personal proximity as well as human reverence towards Mother Nature, as seen in many of her signature works. Audiences and *a.m. post* editors alike are thrown into Tschäpe's reverie of nature replete with artistic organisms collectively forming the amalgamation of a complexly articulated botanical vision.

Whether you're in the East or the West, natural landscape is definitely not a new thing in the realm of art. The insignificance of human existence when juxtaposed against the larger, more majestic grandeur of nature has always been captivating to see when reflected from the soul of artists – and Tschäpe is no exception. "You know, we come from nature. All the science and research we do bring you further about different topics that are outside our nature. So, for me, drawing and studying nature get me closer to a lot of other questions," says Tschäpe. "Like you look at the patterns that a flower has – how detailed, how geometric it is, how linear things can be and when you look at it, it brings you to a different space."

Tschäpe suggests a microcosmic, if not biological, perspective in her veneration towards nature has helped open a window into her world of art. But what exactly drew her to this specific perspective and particular penchant for nature? "I'm from Brazil. My family comes from the countryside in Brazil. They are all farmers. So on every weekend and vacation, we went to the farm. It was like 19th century, you know. My uncle went by horse to town to go to the church. We had no electricity, no TV. So there was no artificial life. You kind of had to learn from scratch how to do something. This was a childhood memory that sticks in my head very much."

Whether or not one understands where Tschäpe's sense of nature is budded from, her works of landscapes leave viewers flabbergasted and offer up a visual match to other 'landscapes' of a realistic sort.

Tschäpe has a clear individuality: nature is not objectified as the final visual outcome in her works; instead, it plays as a facilitator throughout the process of creation, helping each step along to the next. This applies to all her cutouts, paintings, videos or photography. "I like to expose things in nature and see what happens and the videos allow me to record the process of it because I don't really plan out things completely. I let the process lead to my result."

Each year, Brazilian-German artist Janaina Tschäpe spends at least one month with her family in their country home in Brazil. Keeping in touch with nature fuels the New York-based artist's creativity, she says.

"I don't want to lose those elements - things like making a fire blaze at night, or just walking through the woods - because they inform so much. It's really essential for my art," says Tschäpe. "The way nature builds things is organic and incredibly intelligent. There's no way for me to think about work without incorporating that, and without being in that space."

Tschäpe takes nature as her inspiration; her work explores its patterns, composition, geometrical shapes, and repetition. Her recent work has focused on depicting her relationship with the natural landscape in a three-dimensional form.

For her first Hong Kong solo show, the colourful installation *Geometric Shapes* (2014) is flanked by two paintings, *Contemplating Landscape* (2014) and *Dark Sea* (2014). Tschäpe says that *Contemplating Landscape*, the show's centre piece, began with just a horizon line.

Then she noticed a relationship between the cubes featured in *Geometric Shapes* and the other two paintings, and idea of exploring the distance between the physical body and the horizon began to take shape.

"The cubes appear to be looking at the horizon. It was a very beautiful way to combine the three works," she explains, adding that standing in between the two paintings is like "waking up with *Contemplating Landscape* and going to bed with *Dark Sea* when the sun sets."

This attempt to visualise the dialogue between 2-D and 3-D representations continues in *Ocean Study II* (2014), an installation that shows how lines can literally leap right off the page.

"There's a search for something that is beyond my imagination, and I think that search is what really feeds me to paint and draw. It's like searching for where can I go and what can I compose with the colours and the shapes. It's like trying to discover a place that I don't know yet, a kind of exploration. It's navigating through a universe in which I might find a new island."

When inspiration comes naturally

Each year, Brazilian-German artist Janaina Tschäpe spends at least one month with her family in their country home in Brazil. Keeping in touch with nature fuels the New York-based artist's creativity, she says.

"I don't want to lose those elements – things like making a fire blaze at night, or just walking through the woods – because they inform so much. It's really essential for my art," says Tschäpe. "The way nature builds things is organic and incredibly intelligent. There's no way for me to think about work without incorporating that, and without being in that space."

Tschäpe takes nature as her inspiration; her work explores its patterns, composition, geometrical shapes, and repetition. Her recent work has focused on depicting her relationship with the natural landscape in a three-dimensional form.

For her first Hong Kong solo show, the colourful installation *Geometric*

Shapes (2014) is flanked by two paintings, *Contemplating Landscape* (2014) and *Dark Sea* (2014). Tschäpe says that *Contemplating Landscape*, the show's centre piece, began with just a horizon line.

Then she noticed a relationship between the cubes featured in *Geometric Shapes* and the other two paintings, and idea of exploring the distance between the physical body and the horizon began to take shape.

"The cubes appear to be looking at the horizon. It was a very beautiful way to combine the three works," she explains, adding that standing in between the two paintings is like "waking up with *Contemplating Landscape* and going to bed with *Dark Sea* when the sun sets."

This attempt to visualise the dialogue between 2-D and 3-D representations continues in *Ocean Study II* (2014), an installation that shows how lines can literally leap right off the page.

"There's a search for something that is beyond my imagination, and I think

that search is what really feeds me to paint and draw. It's like searching for where can I go and what can I compose with the colours and the shapes. It's like trying to discover a place that I don't know yet, a kind of exploration. It's navigating through a universe in which I might find a new island."

Tony Tasset: *Artists Monument*

The sun is shining this weekend on the names of 392,486 modern and contemporary artists – from Pablo Picasso to Andy Warhol – at New York's Hudson River Park. American multimedia artist Tony Tasset has etched the names alphabetically on multicolored cubes that make up his latest monolithic installation for the Whitney Biennial (under way until 25 May). The randomly arranged squares create a long horizontal monument celebrating the artistic community from the past two centuries, and is an effort to eliminate hierarchies by listing the greats unceremoniously next to up-and-comers. The *Artists Monument* is near the Whitney's future home at Washington and Gansevoort Streets – where the museum will move in the spring of 2015.

Liars: *Mess*

Australian-American trio Liars have been pursuing pop's darker boundaries for over a decade now, but the LA band's relentless approach to reinvention means that every record might as well be a brand new start. *Mess*, their seventh album continues the band's ongoing process of mutation that saw them first emerge in 2000 amid a flurry of angular post-punk shapes, has taken in folk-influenced ghostly soundscapes, settled into creeping pop-noir on 2010's excellent *Sisterworld*, and then threw everything in the bin again for 2012's more dance music-favoured *WIXIW*. *Mess* actually does the unthinkable and continues that dancier sound for a two-album run, albeit louder, stranger – messier. It won't last.

EMBRACING RISK

Never mind risk management. Art is about confronting and challenging life in all its facets

Artists are consummate risk takers. Painters don't get guaranteed bonuses, sculptors cannot blame their mistakes on a rogue chisel and there is no career path for conceptualists.

While financial types talk about managing and minimising risk, artists embrace life's uncertainties as just another raw material they must work with. New York-based artist Janaina Tschaepe, for example, is a master at making mistakes. Her watercolour paintings are mainly abstract images inspired by natural landscapes and created by brushstrokes and drips.

"I have to control the drip and all the things that are a mistake in the painting, and I compose that and make it part of the painting again," she said during a trip to Hong Kong for *Contemplating Landscape*, her first solo exhibition in the territory, at Edouard Malingue Gallery that runs until May 3. "I painted in oil for a while and there was always this option of covering up something and I didn't like that process as much. I like the idea of dealing with the existing problem. With watercolour, you cannot erase anything. I like the idea of dealing with the drip, which is something I didn't plan. I have to challenge myself to fix it."

But the biggest challenge comes when an artist finishes a work or a collection and puts it on display. "There's always a risk with showing any artist, whether Asian or Western, for

the first time," said Lorraine Malingue, director of Edouard Malingue Gallery.

Finding an audience is the trick. Dutch master Vincent van Gogh sold only one painting during his lifetime, but today's art market is embracing technology to connect artists with paying collectors — hopefully long before they die.

Alexandre Errera, founder and chief executive of artshare.com, an online platform dedicated to the exhibition and sale of contemporary Chinese art launched last year, is bullish about the prospects of his venture: "There has actually been a steady and important shift towards buying artworks without seeing them in person, whether via jpeg, online galleries or online auctions."

In our shrinking world, it is becoming easier — and less risky — for artists to find an audience. Gallery Sumukha's solo exhibition of works by Indian artist Jayasri Burman in March was an attempt to create an interest in Indian contemporary art among Chinese collectors.

"While there is a risk and cost involved in doing that, what is truly heartening and interesting to see is the reaction of new audiences to an international artist," said Premilla Baid, director of Gallery Sumukha. "Chinese collectors have started looking at artworks from around the globe."

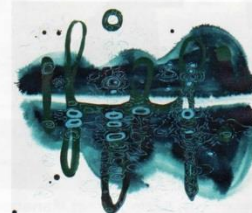
The potential audience is getting bigger and easier to

find, but life as an artist is no less difficult today. "With exhibitions, I hardly go into it as something that will 100% make profit, although I go into it 100% believing in the artists and in the work that they do," said Zoe Pena, founder of Lightbombs Contemporary, a Hong Kong-based art advisory with a focus on Filipino contemporary art that is hosting an exhibition in May, *New Natives*, featuring 28 contemporary Filipino artists.

"I have always found that earnest passion is instinctual and infectious," she said. "There is risk as it comes with everything in art. But with regard to the market for Philippine contemporary art, if one feels that desire from collectors and art lovers to know more about these artists, then one is already on the right track. An investment is never an investment without risk."

The same can be said about a life without risk. **FA**

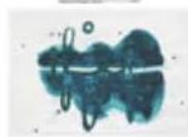

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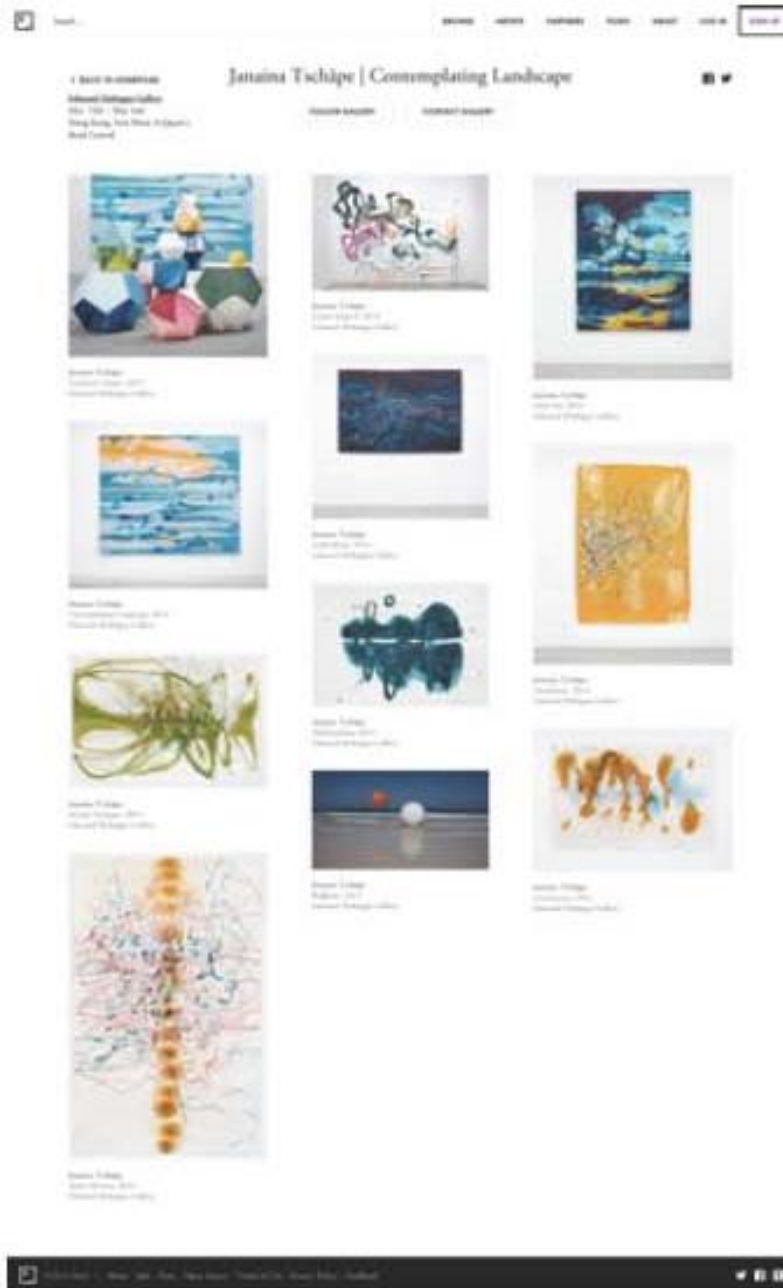



Qual a data do seu aniversário chinês?



Seria de se imaginar que o complicado sistema lunisolar de marcar tempo, estabelecido pelo Imperador Huangdi, em 2637 antes de Cristo, fosse de todo abandonado com a adoção por Mao-Tse-tung do calendário gregoriano de uso quase universal. Contudo, o milenar almanaque continua em uso para calcular épocas de festas e festivais tradicionais, para registrar datas de nascimento e, em especial, fazer horóscopos. A continuada relevância das antigas folhinhas chinesas pode ser evidenciada, inclusive, no fato de que entidade tão moderna e científica como o "Hong Kong Observatory", encarregado dos serviços meteorológicos da cidade, possui no seu site tabela de conversão do calendário lunar para o gregoriano que abarca os anos de 1901 até 2100. Em outras palavras, os meteorologistas locais acreditam que o almanaque do Imperador Huangdi ainda vai ser utilizado, pelo menos, até a virada do Século XXII.

Voltemos à indagação do título do artigo, ou seja, em que data cai o seu aniversário chinês em 2014? Em outras palavras, existe o aniversário gregoriano e outra data de nascimento retirada do calendário chinês antigo. Em suma, duas festas de aniversário ou dois dias para congratular os amigos.

Como ponto de partida, há que descobrir qual o dia do seu nascimento no antigo calendário chinês. A título ilustrativo, tomemos pessoa nascida

em 9 de novembro de 1948. Um site de uso simples é o <http://www.prokerala.com/general/calendar/chinese-year-converter.php>, onde se confirma que a data ocidental corresponde ao nono dia do décimo mês do ano 4646. No mesmo site encontramos que a pessoa, no corrente ano, isto é, ano 4712 (ou 2014), estará apagando as velinhas no bolo de aniversário em 30 de novembro. Como nota de curiosidade, no bolo de aniversário chinês haverá pelo menos uma vela a mais do que no "cake" ocidental. Os chineses, com muita sabedoria, consideram o momento do nascimento como ano 1 e não, como nas contas ocidentais, como momento zero da vida.

A esta altura do artigo cumpre sublinhar que a data chinesa de nascimento revela muito mais do que a simples idade. Por exemplo, quem nasceu em 9/XI/1948 pertence ao ano do rato (elemento terra). Para os apreciadores de horóscopo, a cultura chinesa traz uma riqueza de informações sobre como irá transcorrer o presente ano, sobre a personalidade da pessoa em questão, sobre se está em momento bom ou vulnerável, etc. Cumpre mencionar que, ao contrário da imagem ocidental negativa dos ratos, no zodíaco chinês os nascidos sob este signo são tidos como ambiciosos, inteligentes, tenazes, trabalhadores e confiantes em si mesmos. Na China e no Japão são vistos como símbolos de sorte e riqueza. Em suma, gente de muitos êxitos.

Alguns leitores já terão adivinhado de que estamos tratando neste exemplo de uma das mais importantes pessoas do Brasil, em futuro próximo: Luiz Felipe Scolari, nascido em Passo Fundo, RS, em 9 de novembro de 1948, treinador, desde 2012, da Seleção Brasileira de Futebol.
